Thanks for the second chance! The Lord is Risen indeed! Thanks be to God. We are in the wake of Easter. We are reminded of our need for God and the very reason why Jesus came.

Have you ever failed at something or made a major mistake? Have you ever been wronged by someone else or been affected by another's failure? How did you respond? Did you nurse a grudge? Were you eager and willing to forgive -seeking to give another chance at a relationship?

As we get to know Jesus, we realize that He is slow to anger and quick to forgive. One of the Gospel readings in Easter week features a wonderful encounter between Jesus and Peter. The events that precede that encounter set the stage for it. Peter's actions and had left a huge trail of wreckage. It was Peter's darkest hour.

Let me remind you about Peter's resume. He was the one who claimed that he would never fall away from Jesus as he believed the others would. Peter was the one who tried to correct Jesus and persuade Him not to go to the cross. Yes, it was Peter who claimed he would NEVER deny Jesus! HE DID. Three times! This was quite a resume! Jesus goes to the cross, dies and then rises again. The stage is now set.

So, we come to the encounter -recorded in John Chapter 21. After a fruitless and frustrating night of fishing, Jesus encourages his disciples to try again -this time putting their nets on the other side. There was a tremendous catch.

Following their fishing "trip," Jesus invites the group to a wonderful breakfast with Hosted by him, on the beach. Fish was on the menu. But there was a huge elephant in the room. Jesus calls "Simon" (Peter's former name). Symbolically, Jesus asks Simon if he truly loved Him three times -equaling the denials. With that, Peter is now again in the fold-given a new opportunity to begin again. Jesus then calls Peter to a new greater level of service- "Feed my sheep!" Jesus commands.

The Book of Acts documents how the forgiven and empowered Peter flourishes and builds God's Kingdom. None of it would have been possible if Jesus had refused to forgive or even condemn Peter. The Lord gave Peter another opportunity. What a tremendous burden Jesus lifted from Peter.

In the same way, Jesus is always ready to forgive you. While it is true that relationships are complicated, and there are varying degrees of offences that affect us all, Jesus calls us to be ready to forgive, practice forgiveness and be at least willing to offer another chance. He calls us to forgive and release each other.

So, in the wake of the Resurrection and as you and I have been forgiven and given new starts OVER AND OVER AND OVER, perhaps it's time for you to begin fresh and with someone. Let Jesus last say from the cross ring in your ears: Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do!" In the love of the Lord, **-Rob+**

Memory Verse- **Romans 12:9** Be sincere in your love for others. Hate everything that is evil and hold tight to everything that is good.



Has someone ever surprised you by doing something kind for you? Maybe your brother did one of your chores without being asked. Perhaps your neighbor brought over some cookies, just because? Maybe your classmate helped clean up the juice you spilled? How did you feel when someone did an unexpected kind thing for you? We know someone cares for us because their actions let us feel it.

SCIENTIFIC PROOF OF NOAH'S FLOOD

Exquisitely Preserved Fossils -During the flood, many creatures were buried and fossilized so quickly that they were exquisitely preserved. Because many fish were buried alive, the fine details of their fins and eye sockets have been preserved. Even the compound lenses in many trilobite eyes are still available for detailed study.

Delicate species were also well preserved. *Mawsonites spriggi* is a fossilized jellyfish that was found in a sandstone bed covering more than 400 square miles (1,040 km²) of the South Australian outback. Thousands of these jellyfish are impeccably preserved in this sandstone bed. This is significant because soft-bodied creatures like jellyfish that wash onto a beach today melt in the sun or are destroyed by crashing waves. Based on this knowledge, the discoverer concluded that all of these fossilized, soft-bodied marine creatures were buried in less than a day.

Only a rapid burial could preserve fossils with such fine detail, like this *ichthyosaurus*. Some squids were fossilized with ink still in their ink sacs. And in a classic example of rapid burial, an ichthyosaur (marine reptile) about 6 feet (2 meters) long was fossilized at the moment of giving birth. One minute this huge creature had just delivered her baby, then seconds later, without time to escape, mother and baby were entombed in a catastrophic avalanche of lime mud. Only the catastrophic global flood could rapidly bury so many large creatures in layers that are so extensive.
