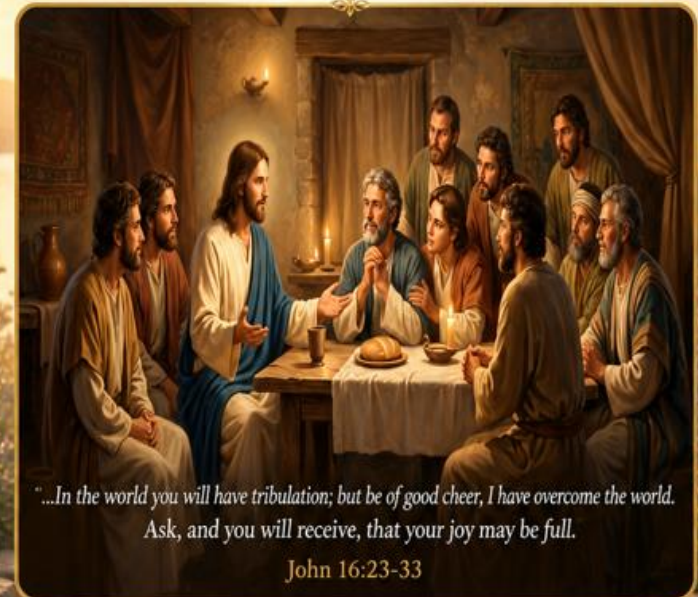

Let's hear it for Moms!

Happy Mother's Day to our mothers and to those who provide motherly care. How important they are! How many times did she pick you up when you fell? How often did she encourage you when you couldn't see a possibility? How many moms courageously picked up the pieces when they were left to lead a household...on their own? How many of our moms have introduced us to Jesus...and modeled His character in their lives? I am also willing to bet that she sang to you before you were born!

Here is what the bible tells us about the significance of mothers in our lives. In the book of Proverbs, we read this: ***"She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children arise and call her blessed."*** Also, it says: ***My children, keep your father's command and do not forsake your mother's teaching. Bind them always on your heart; fasten them around your neck.*** (Proverbs 31 & Proverbs 6).

Here are two notable examples of strong mothers in the bible: Hannah was the mother of Samuel. She waited on God for him to give her a son. When Samuel came along, Hannah faithfully raised him. Over time, Samuel became one of the greatest prophets of old.

Then, there is Lois- the mother of Eunice, who was the mother of Timothy. Both Lois and Eunice are commended for their faithfulness to God. Paul encourages Timothy never to forget the influence of his mom and grandma. He writes: "I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also" (2 Timothy 1:5). Common to all the examples mentioned, and all the others not mentioned is the desire to be faithful to God.

What qualities do you see in your mom? I am so thankful to my own mom, who continues to be an example of godly goodness and love. Over the years, she has injected steel into my soul...***and still does!***

May God continue to bless our moms who are still with and comfort those of us whose moms are no longer with us but hold a special place in our hearts.

Jochebed, the mother of Moses, is first introduced in Book of Exodus 2, during one of the darkest times in Israel's history. The descendants of Jacob had lived in

Happy **MOTHER'S SUNDAY**

TODAY WE WILL LEARN ABOUT
A MOTHER OF COURAGE, FAITH, AND DESTINY

A TIME OF FEAR AND OPPRESSION: The Israelites were living in Egypt when a new Pharaoh, who did not know Joseph, feared their growing numbers and ordered that every Hebrew baby boy be thrown into the Nile River.

A MOTHER OF COURAGE AND FAITH: Jochebed, from the tribe of Levi and wife of Amram, hid her son for three months. When she could no longer hide him, she made a basket of bulrushes, sealed it with tar and pitch, and placed her baby among the reeds, trusting God with his life. Miriam, his sister, watched from a distance.

GOD'S PROVIDENCE: Pharaoh's daughter found the basket, had compassion, and saw that the child was a Hebrew. Miriam bravely offered to find a Hebrew woman to nurse him. In God's wonderful provision, Jochebed herself was chosen to care for her own son, and she was even paid to do so.

A LASTING INFLUENCE: During Moses' early years, Jochebed shaped his identity and faith. Though he grew up in Pharaoh's palace, he never forgot he was a Hebrew. Her influence prepared him for the calling God had for his life.

A MOTHER OF GREAT LEADERS: Jochebed was also the mother of Miriam and Aaron. Miriam became a prophetess and worship leader. Aaron became Moses' spokesman and later the first high priest of Israel. All three children were used powerfully by God.

LESSONS FROM JOCHEBED: She was courageous, creative, wise, and faithful. She protected her children, nurtured their gifts, and most importantly, placed them into God's hands, trusting Him with their future. Her example reminds us that godly parenting is about both care and preparation.

A STORY OF FAITH AND DESTINY: What seemed hopeless became the beginning of God's plan. Through Jochebed's faith, God raised up Moses, the deliverer of Israel. Through one faithful mother, God impacted an entire nation.

She placed the child in it and put it among the reeds by the river bank.
EXODUS 2:3

Her faith saved a life. Her faith shaped a leader. Her faith changed a nation.

Thank you, Lord, for the gift of mothers!

Egypt for hundreds of years and had multiplied into a great nation. A new Pharaoh, who did not remember Joseph or the good he had done for Egypt, became fearful of the growing Hebrew population. Afraid that the Israelites might become powerful and rise against Egypt, Pharaoh ordered that every Hebrew baby boy be killed by being thrown into the Nile River.

In the middle of this fear and oppression, Jochebed displayed remarkable courage

and faith. She and her husband, Amram, were from the tribe of Levi. When Jochebed gave birth to a son, she recognized him as a special child and hid him for three months, risking her own life to protect him. But when she could no longer hide him safely, she prepared a basket made of bulrushes and waterproofed it with tar and pitch. With a mother's love and a heart full of trust in God, she placed her baby among the reeds along the Nile River. Nearby stood his sister Miriam, watching carefully to see what would happen.

By God's perfect providence, Pharaoh's daughter came to the river to bathe and discovered the basket. When she opened it and saw the crying baby, she felt compassion for him and realized he was one of the Hebrew children. Miriam bravely approached Pharaoh's daughter and offered to find a Hebrew woman to nurse the child. In an amazing act of God's provision, Jochebed herself was brought back to care for her own son, and Pharaoh's daughter even paid her to nurse him.

During Moses' early childhood, Jochebed had the opportunity to shape his identity and faith. Though Moses would later grow up in Pharaoh's palace with wealth and privilege, he never forgot that he was a Hebrew. Jochebed's influence clearly remained in his heart and helped prepare him for the calling God had planned for his life.

Jochebed was also the mother of Miriam and Aaron, two other important leaders in Israel's history. Miriam became a prophetess and worship leader who led the women of Israel in praise after crossing the Red Sea. Aaron became Moses' spokesman before Pharaoh and later the first high priest of Israel. It is remarkable that all three of Jochebed's children were chosen by God for significant leadership roles among His people.

Jochebed's story teaches us many important lessons. She was courageous in the face of danger, creative in protecting her child, wise in raising her children, and faithful in trusting God when circumstances seemed impossible. Perhaps most importantly, she was willing to place her children into God's hands, trusting Him with their future. Her example reminds us that godly parenting is not only about protection and care, but also about nurturing children in faith and allowing God's purpose to unfold in their lives.

The story of Jochebed is ultimately a story of faith, trust, and God's providence. What seemed like a hopeless situation became the beginning of God's plan to raise up Moses, the future deliverer of Israel. Through one faithful mother, God impacted an entire nation.
