Love Wins.

One of the most popular Scriptures which many couples choose to have read at their weddings comes from 1 Corinthians chapter 13. While the context of this chapter concerns "an attitude of humility and charity concerning Spiritual Gifts," there are some principles that have a universal application.

The chapter begins with a challenge that without love, even our greatest accomplishments and talents are meaningless and empty. But then, Paul reminds us of characteristics of love. He writes: *“Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.”* (1 Cor 13:4-8)

Paul was writing to a Corinthian Church that seemed to have developed some serious divisions. Paul was calling them to account for their actions. The Corinthians were reminded of their relationship with Christ -members of his body. As His body, they must love one another. Summing up Paul in this section: “If your actions towards others are done with patience, kindness, gentleness, humility, honor and in hope, then that is what love looks like.”

Here are some questions that all of us need to consider. Have you ever experienced the Love of God in your life? How was it expressed? What are some ways that you can allow the love of Jesus to flow through you to others?

Jesus' love draws us together. Jesus' love brings healing and unity. Jesus' love wins us over!





Jesus is THE WAY and His love will enable us to develop and grow together.

HOW TO GROW IN PRAYER

Prayer is more than just a routine; it's a deep, intimate conversation with God. Even though He knows everything we are about to say, prayer is intended for our relationship with God. However, it's not uncommon to sometimes feel lost about what to say or how to approach it. The Bible teaches us the basic structure and facets of prayer that can help you in your walk with God.

Do This While You Pray:

-  **Thank God** (1 Thess 5:17-18),
-  **Confess your sins** (1 Jn 1:19),
-  **Intercede** (1 Tim 2:1),
-  **Meditate on His Word** (Ps 1:1-2) & **Listen to the Holy Spirit** (Jn 14:26).

Praise God (Heb 13:15).

Ask God for your needs (Mt 7:7).

Wait on God (Is 40:31).

Thank God- Start your prayer by expressing gratitude (1 Thessalonians 5:17-18). It's essential to understand that we shouldn't necessarily thank God for every circumstance, but we can find reasons to give thanks *in* every situation. Psalm 100:4 reminds us to “Enter into His gates with thanksgiving and into His courts with praise.” So, as you begin your prayer, thank Him for His protection, health, salvation, and countless other blessings. *Your faith strengthens as you praise God.*

Praising God- Praising God goes beyond thanking Him for what He has done (Hebrews 13:15). It involves recognizing and worshiping Him for who He is. To do this, I encourage you to grow in your understanding of God's nature and attributes. When you do this, you'll praise Him out of a revelation of who He is.

Confess Your Sins- Acknowledging our wrongdoings is a crucial step in prayer (1 John 1:9). Jesus emphasizes forgiveness in Mark 11:25-26, teaching that if we hold grudges against others, it impedes our own forgiveness.

Ask God for What You Need God desires to hear your needs, dreams, and aspirations (Matthew 7:7). Share your daily challenges, concerns and wishes with Him. *Prayer is a cure for stress because in prayer you exchange your stress for God's strength.* Begin to vocalize your needs before God; when you do, an exchange happens, and you begin to transfer your worry to God. God begins to worry about your problem and gives you peace. Invite the Lord into your situation and allow Him to intervene. We do this through our petitioning.

Intercession- is standing in the gap for others (1 Timothy 2:1). Intercession has three components. The first one is when you're interceding with someone, then when you're praying for someone.

Wait Upon God- Waiting upon God is often overlooked (Isaiah 40:31). I want to encourage you to linger in God's presence. When you're done thanking Him, praising Him, and even praying for others, don't just go. Choose to linger in His presence a while longer. Maybe God is not done with you yet.

Meditate on His Word -Meditating on God's Word isn't just about reading the Bible (Psalm 1:1-2); it's about pondering its teachings. It is during this phase that Scriptures often come alive, revealing deeper insights and applications for our lives. By regularly setting aside time to meditate on His Word, we can receive wisdom, guidance, and understanding directly from the heart of God. *One word from God can change your life.*

Listen to the Holy Spirit- Prayer is a two-way communication (John 14:26). As much as we talk to God, it is equally important to pause and listen. The Holy Spirit speaks to our hearts, often offering comfort, direction, or correction.
